Bhagwan Mahaveer Foundation was established in 1994 to identify, encourage and honour the individuals and institutions doing selfless service for the welfare of the underprivileged and the weak in our society. With a view to focus public attention on the activities of these altruistic persons and encourage others to emulate them and take up community and social services, the Bhagwan Mahaveer Foundation has instituted the Mahaveer Awards which is given every year.

How to Naminate

A nominee can be sponsored by an individual, institution or be self-nominated. The nominee may send the filled-in nomination form through post or as Email.

Last date to submit the Nomination form is 31st July 2019. Incomplete forms will be considered ineligible.

Award Categories

1. Non-Violence & Vegetarianism (NVV)

The activities of the nominee may include the following:

- a. Propagation, Promotion and Practice of non-violence and vegetarianism
- b Protection and care of animals, birds and reptiles.
- c. Possess a sense of selflessness and compassion in service to others
- d Specific instances when violence was averted and solutions and agreements reached by non-violent methods.
- e Creative work in promoting Non-Violence/Vegetarianism.

couration (EDU)

The activities of the nominee may include the following:

- a. Potential ideas that bring about improvement in educational practice
- b. Efforts to educate the people living in remote rural areas.
- c. Improvement in communication systems, Computer technology, Literacy campaigns, improvement in attendance in rural schools, reduction of school dropouts etc.
- d. Achievements through Innovative educational practices.
- e. Contribution to the furtherance of Education Movement.
- f. Education may include vocational training or any alternative system of education, education for the differently abled children, promoting indigenous education, application of technology in education, etc.
- g. Care, education and rehabilitation of the mentally retarded and the physically challenged (including spastics, slow learners) and dyslexic children and so on.

3. Medicine (MED)

The activities of the nominee may include the following:

- a. Dedication to the care of underserved populations.
- b. Demonstrated altruism, compassion and personal sacrifice while providing quality health care to a destitute, distressed or marginalized population in an impoverished community.
- c. Demonstrates productive improvement towards medicine.
- d. Contributing and working to ensure better healthcare for India's rural population.
- e. An Indian citizen who is not a qualified medical professional but is contributing towards better health for rural India. He/she could be contributing to spreading awareness or be actively involved in creating better healthcare infrastructure.
- f. Focusing on providing health & hygiene betterment services.
- g. Free or low cost medical care facilities for women and children, pre-natal and post-natal care, education for better health and hygiene, better nutrition for children.
- h. Non-profit medical institutions serving the society
- Persons involved in setting up of the medical institutions for the welfare of the poor and underprivileged.

amonity & Social Service (CSS)

Fixe activities of the nominee may include the following:

- E Supply of pure drinking water, initiation and improvement in sanitary facilities, low cost balanced diet.
- b. Improvement in village roads, transport and communication systems
- c. Rehabilitation of vulnerable children, work in slums.
- d. Free or low cost legal aid to women in distress, creating general awareness among women about their rights and the laws pertaining thereto, reforms for enhancing the social status of women.
- e. Care, education and rehabilitation of the mentally retarded and the physically challenged (including spastics, slow learners) and dyslexic children and so on.
- f. Adult Education
- g. Rehabilitation of persons afflicted by leprosy
- h. Dalit and Tribal Welfare
- i. Health, Hygiene and Sanitation
- j. Removal of Untouchability
- k. Rural Development
- Any other activity done for the general welfare of masses.

5. Women Social Entrepreneur/Achiever with Indian Values (WSE)

The award is given to inspire women who demonstrate vision, resilience and role model leadership, setting an example for others, and who participate in all spheres and issues related to women, to do selfless service to the needy and poor and to follow Indian values. This category would be for a woman

- a) Who promotes Indian values and traditions like care for the family and society, respect for the elders and other similar values.
- b) Who has helped to uplift the family and society
- c) Who has excelled in any non-commercial field
- d) Who has been a role model for the family and the society.

The activities of the nominee may include:

- a. Working at the grassroots and contributing significantly by taking measures to eradicate illiteracy, provide vocational training, rehabilitation of women and children etc.
- b. Free or low cost medical care facilities for women and children, pre-natal and post-natal care, education for improved health and hygiene, better nutrition for children.
- c. Rehabilitation of children working in slums.

Eninging reforms for enhancing the social status of women.

- f Care, education and rehabilitation of the mentally and physically challenged children.
- g. Working for the upliftment of mentally and physically abused, neglected, deserted, exploited women and widows, especially from rural and tribal areas.
- h. Working for the uncared, discarded, destitute and exploited children, including orphana, especially from rural areas.
- i. Contributing in establishment of Micro Enterprise, women self help groups, etc. in rural and tribal areas.

Eligibility

Only individuals who are Indian Nationals and institutions based in India and doing work of a very high standard in India are eligible for these awards. Work carried out during recent times would merit consideration. One major criterion for the award would relate to the benefits reaching the economically and the socially backward sections of the community e.g. SC/STs, women and children.

Guidelines

- Self-nominations are accepted.
- 1. The nominees and the sponsors should send factual information about the overall work done.
- A brief note on the nature of activities and the area of services provided by the nominee over the years should be furnished. The Nominees applying for the category Women Social Entrepreneur/Achiever must indicate the activities done for the family and the society separately.
- Please specify the period since when the nominee has been rendering service; the geographical area and the number of persons benefited. The nominee must have been rendering service for a minimum of 10 years
