1 RTI is a Fundamental Right (FR) guaranteed under Part 3, Article 19(1) (a) of the Constitution of India. 2 Further it is a Constitutional Right (CR), as all FR are constitutional rights but not vice versa. Example: Article 300A Right to Property is a CR but not FR. It was once a FR under Article 19(1) (f) which was omitted by 44th Constitutional Amendment Act 1978. 3 Going further it is a Legal Right (LR) as all CR are LR but not vice versa. Example: Right to Vote is a LR under Section 62(1) of Representation of People Act 1951 but not CR. So RTI is a FR, a CR and a LR. RTI act 2005 is merely a statutorily sanctioned procedure to exercise FR to Information under Article 19(1) (a).
